2017 Jennifer's Russian River Valley CHARDONNAY From the Russian River and a windy, cool vineyard near Sebastopol, the 2017 Chardonnay Jennifer's (100% old Wente clone) was fermented and aged 16 months in 30% new French oak. It's one of the more dense, concentrated wines in the lineup and offers gorgeous caramelized pineapple, flower oil, chalky minerality, brioche, and lemon curd-like aromas and flavors. Rich, full-bodied, and concentrated, it packs an incredible amount of intensity yet still stays chiseled, elegant, and focused on the palate, with incredible length. It's a stunning wine in every sense. Drink bottles any time over the coming decade. – J.D., May 2020

99 POINTS 2017 Seascape Vineyard Sonoma Coast CHARDONNAY Coming from a site on a panoramic ridgetop located at 1150 feet in elevation, west of the town of Occidental and facing Bodega Bay, the 2017 Chardonnay Seascape Vineyard is another magical effort from this estate and is a quintessential Sonoma Coast Chardonnay. White flowers, salty minerality, apple blossom, and tart pineapple all emerge from the glass, and it's medium to full-bodied and has a wonderful purity, bright (almost racy) acidity, and a great finish. Brought up in 42% new French oak, it shows almost no trace of its élevage, and while tight and slightly closed on the palate, it's nevertheless insanely good. Give bottles another year and enjoy over the following decade. – J.D., May 2020

2017 Stone Côte Vineyard Sonoma Coast CHARDONNAY From a site on the Sonoma Coast (this comes all from a block within the Durell Vineyard), the 2017 Chardonnay Stone Côte Vineyard reminds me of a Grand Cru Chablis on steroids, with gorgeous lemon curd, iodine, white flowers, crushed chalky, and a touch of green almond, with its oak beautifully integrated. Showing medium to full-bodied richness as well as flawless balance, this is a Chardonnay that builds with time in the glass as well as on the palate and has bright, salty acidity and incredible length. Beautifully done, it's another thrilling Chardonnay from this estate. – J.D., May 2020

It shows the more supple, easygoing style of the vintage for Chardonnay yet still has beautiful freshness, good concentration, and a great finish. – J.D., May 2020

Three Jacks Vineyard Green Valley of the Russian River Valley CHARDONNAY Another release from the cooler, Green Valley region of the Russian River Valley, the 2017 Chardonnay Three Jacks Vineyard comes from vines planted in 1995 (clones: old Wente, Rued, Dijon 95 and Clone 15) and was fermented and aged in one-third new French oak. Baked apples, toasted bread, spice, honeycomb, and caramelized pineapple notes all dominate the bouquet, and this beauty has a touch of Meursault-like style in its rich, powerful, waxy, honeyed profile. Balanced and textured, with good acidity and a great finish, it's another seriously good Chardonnay from this estate to drink over the following 7-8 years. – J.D., May 2020

Fog Dance Vineyard Green Valley of the Russian River Valley CHARDONNAY Brought up in 40% new French oak, the 2017 Chardonnay Fog Dance Vineyard comes from the Green Valley portion of the Russian River and has an exuberant, upfront array of tropical fruits, caramelized pineapple, white flower, orange blossom, and brioche. This beauty is rich and opulently textured, with its oak pushed all the way into the background, and follows with a great finish. It's brilliant stuff. – J.D., May 2020

Far Coast Vineyard Sonoma Coast PINOT NOIR Coming from a block located on a northern facing ridge north of Fort Ross, on the Sonoma Coast, the 2017 Pinot Noir Far Coast Vineyard was destemmed and spent 17 months in 32% new French oak. Bottled unfined and unfiltered, it offers a deeper, richer, more savory bouquet of black cherry and darker currant fruits as well as loads of ground herbs, chocolate, forest floor, and spice. This rich, opulent, incredibly sexy Pinot Noir has a wealth of fruit, a rounded, seamless texture, and a great finish. It's a rock star in this stacked lineup and a gem of a wine in the vintage. Jennifer's Russian River Valley PINOT NOIR One of the standouts in the lineup, the 2017 Pinot Noir Jennifer's comes from a vineyard south of Sebastopol, which sees lots of influence from the Petaluma Gap. Brought up largely in neutral oak (32% new), its deeper ruby/purple hue is followed by terrific notes of black raspberries, cedarwood, bay leaf, forest floor, and graphite. This head-turner is medium-bodied and has beautiful concentration, bright yet integrated acidity, and a killer finish. Locked and loaded, it needs 2-3 years of bottle age at a minimum, and my money is on it drinking brilliantly at age 20. It's a stunning, singular wine from this estate! — J.D., May 2020

Arrendell Vineyard Russian River Valley PINOT NOIR Coming from an incredibly cold site in the Russian River Valley that was planted in 1975 to the heritage Martini clone, the 2017 Pinot Noir Arrendell Vineyard was completely destemmed and spent 16 months in 44% new French oak, which is on the higher end for this estate. Bottled unfined and unfiltered, it offers a more fresh, focused, backward style to go with classy Bing cherry and raspberry fruits as well as notes of spice, sappy herbs, and spring flowers, It has a kiss of background oak (which will integrated with 1-2 years of bottle age), good acidity, and ripe tannins, yet unquestionably needs 2-3 years of bottle age to show its full potential. This beautiful, potential-packed beauty that will be one of the longer-lived releases here.

Seascape Vineyard Sonoma Coast PINOT NOIR Coming from the Sonoma Coast, the 2017 Pinot Noir Seascape Vineyard nevertheless seems to have a touch of Russian River-like opulence and power, showing loads of mulberry and cranberry fruit as well as notes of scorched earth, graphite, licorice, and damp forest floor. Rich, concentrated, and medium to full-bodied, it shows the more focused, backward, chiseled style of the vintage yet is far from austere or angular. The cellar will be your friend on this one, and a solid 2-3 years of bottle age are warranted. Nevertheless, it's packed with potential.

Velvet Sisters Anderson Valley PINOT NOIR From the Anderson Valley and a mix of clones (115, 667, 777 and Pommard), aged 16 months in 34% new French oak, the 2017 Pinot Noir Velvet Sisters reveals a ruby/translucent color to go with a kiss of the blue fruit that's always present in Anderson Valley Pinots intermixed with Bing cherries, savory herbs, dried earth, and candied violets. Playing in the medium-bodied end of the spectrum, it has good acidity, plenty of structure, and a great finish, yet its seamless, pure texture is what stands out. My money is on this blossoming with 2-3 years of bottle age, and it's going to drink nicely for a decade. It's impressive. – J.D., May 2020

2017 The 2017 Pinot Noir Fog Dance Vineyard comes from a vineyard located on a hillside in Fog Dance Vineyard Green Valley, south of the town of Forestville (which gets a lot of fog, hence the name), and GREEN VALLEY OF THE was brought up in 47% new French oak. It shows its cooler region nicely yet still has plenty Russian River Valley of richness and depth, offering spiced cherry and berry fruits as well as autumn leaves, spice, PINOT NOIR and dried herb aromas and flavors. Silky, medium to full-bodied, and beautifully balanced, It's a complete, thoroughly satisfying Pinot Noir that has the capacity to evolve positively for a solid 7-8 years. - J.D., May 2020 2018 Starting with the 2018 Pinot Noir Russian River Valley, which comes from multiple sites and 95 POINTS Russian River Valley was brought up in 27% new French oak, it has a vivid ruby hue to go with classic Russian PINOT NOIR River notes of mulled cherry and raspberry fruits, cola, spice box, and dried herbs. It shares plenty of similarities to the Arrendell Vineyard release yet is slightly more PINOT NOIR approachable, with lots of spice, cherry cola, sappy spring flowers, and forest floor aromas and flavors. It nevertheless has the more focused, pure, and locked-and-loaded style, and is going to benefit from 2-3 years of bottle age. It's a beautiful wine. - J.D., May 2020 2017 Coming from Carneros and aged 17 months in one-third new French oak, the 2017 Pinot Sevens Bench Vineyard Noir Seven's Bench sports a medium ruby/purple color as well as a big nose of spiced Los Carneros cherries, candied orange peel, violets, and spicy oak. Rich, medium to full-bodied, beautifully PINOT NOIR textured, and concentrated on the palate, it's another serious release from this estate that's going to reward 2-3 years of bottle age. – J.D., May 2020 2018 Coming from the Far Coast and Seascape Vineyard (both on the Sonoma Coast), the 2017 Land's Edge Vineyards Pinot Noir Land's Edge Vineyards has a spicy, complex, incredibly attractive style that shows Sonoma Coast lots of upfront red and black fruits, dried herbs, and loamy earth aromatics, medium to full PINOT NOIR body, a rounded, supple texture, and a great finish.
