## VINEYARD CHARACTER

The Sta. Rita Hills is situated in a transverse range, meaning the mountains lie east west and not north to south, like most mountain ranges on the Pacific Coast. Cold ocean winds and fog therefore easily travel into the valley and cools it down considerably. The vineyard is situated on the western edge of this unique AVA, on a dramatic, steep slope. Soils in the area are very poor, with elevated calcium levels due to an abundance of ancient sea creature fossils.

# TASTING NOTES

The aroma opens with a beautiful citrus medley of lemon and lime, framed by subtle white flower notes. On the palate this elegant but subtly powerful wine showcases lemon oil with nuances of salty ocean air. The combination of cool climate and poor soils builds the complex, layered texture and lively acidity.
